As you meant so much to Mum I thought I should drop you a line to let you know that Mum passed away on 20 June. She was 87 and would have been 88 in October. Mildura Branch said they had lost their matriarch ©. She never really recovered well after catching pneumonia shortly after Dad died. She ended up with Bronchiectasis that made breathing and obtaining enough oxygen to keep the body going difficult. She had started to deteriorate just before Easter when we went home after her release from hospital and stayed with her rather than our eldest son. I'm glad we did as she required help to use the oxygen that she was required to use regularly.

Mum has assisted many people over the years, more recently with the knitting she did of bedsocks etc. It wasn't until after the funeral and I was going through some of the documents she had stored with the genealogy that it became clearer just how many people she assisted in addition to her role as Relief Society President over the years. There were even letter from the Young Farmers thanking her for some of the craft work she had donated for their stalls.

The funeral was conducted at the Mildura Chapel. We all participated with David giving the Eulogy. Her grandsons were pallbearers. It was thrilling to see her cousins (all around her age, drive up from Geelong to attend).



What a great thrill your letter brought to me! I couldn't remember your promising me a letter, so it was most unexpected and welcome.


